# **189 <u>CORRESPONDENCE</u>**

- a) <u>NCC</u> informing that they have examined the Potholes on Beach Road, Caister and confirm that action is required. Defects are scheduled for repair depending on the nature of the defect and the work needed but on average can take approximately 6 weeks *Noted*
- b) <u>L local Government Boundary Commission for England</u> informing that they are undertaking an electoral review of Norfolk County Council. As part of the review, the Commission is required by legislation to have regard to electorate forecasts for a period of five years after the publication of its final recommendations (in this case, that period is 2025). The Commission has asked NCC to provide updated electorate forecasts by 11<sup>th</sup> February and will extend the existing consultation period by six weeks to 24<sup>th</sup> March 2020. When they have been received, the new electorate forecasts will be published on the Norfolk review site at <u>http://www.lgbce.org.uk/all-reviews/eastern/Norfolk/Norfolk-countycouncil</u> as a result of this, the public consultation on the draft recommendations will now take place from 2<sup>nd</sup> June-10<sup>th</sup> August 2020 Noted
- c) <u>Caister Library</u> requesting whether Parish Council might be able to store two folding display stands which they have been keeping, that were bought for the Village to use at and after the Millennium. A third one is held at Holy Trinity Church. They also have been storing the Village Millennium Domesday collection of folders of photographs and other bits and pieces from that year. This is in five archive boxes, each approximately 2ft x 18 inches x 18 inches : *Agreed to store in Council Hall*
- MCC forwarding a copy of the Norfolk County Council (Caister on Sea, Yarmouth Road) Proposed (Street Parking Places) Amendment Order 2020. The effects of this Order would be to remove the street parking place together with both sign and post, on the length of Yarmouth Road on the West side between Nos.94-102 : *Noted, No Objection*
- e) **<u>ENTUA</u>** forwarding a copy of their Newsletter No.45 March 2020 for information : *Noted*
- f) <u>**Caister Youth Club**</u> requesting Parish Council to endorse their application to CAN to start the process of changing the present Constitution for the Youth Club : *Noted*
- g) <u>GYBC</u> advising that Great Yarmouth Borough Council will publish the Final Draft Local Plan Part 2 under Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) Regulations 2012 on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020. The Local Plan Part 2 builds upon and supplements the adopted Core Strategy which was adopted in 2015. The plan includes a suite of planning policies and a number of site allocations for development.

**Parish Council is invited to make representations (comments) on the document between 28<sup>th</sup> February and 23<sup>rd</sup> April (inclusive)**. Following the representations period, the plan together with all duly made representations will then be submitted to the Secretary of State for independent examination. A Planning Inspector will then determine whether the Final Draft Plan Part 2 is 'sound' and legally compliant by holding a public examination. The Council will also be seeking to confirm a 'five-year supply of housing' through the examination (as per Paragraph 74 of the National Planning Policy Framework) : *Noted, comments already submitted*

# **192 SAFETY CAMERAS**

**Cllr. P Sleet** proposed that Parish Council requests that an enforcement camera be installed on the pedestrian crossing on the High Street before someone is actually killed, as there are an increasing number of incidents happening after 20:00, when the High Street is quiet, of cars travelling at high speed through the Yarmouth Road/ High Street thoroughfare at dangerously high speed breaching the Light Controlled Pedestrian Crossing on Red/Stop irrespective of pedestrians actually present on the crossing whilst it is displaying their right of way : *Resolved matter be referred to Mr J Askew, Traffic Manager, Norfolk County Council*
