NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order affecting the A1064 Main Road from its junction with C457 Tower Road to its junction with C448 Market Road in the PARISH OF FILBY because of stud removal, surface dressing, road marking and stud installation works.

The road will be temporarily closed during the following phases (except for access) between 09:30 and 16:00 from 1) 20^{th} to 25^{th} April 2022; 2) 26^{th} April to 3^{rd} May 2022; and 3) 4^{th} to 6^{th} May 2022 for the duration of the works expected to be about 17 days within the period.

Alternative route is via: A1064 Main Road/Old Road/Acle Link Road, A47 from Acle Parish Boundary to Halvergate Parish Boundary, A47 J A1064 Roundabout, A47 from J A12 to J A1064, Acle New Road, A47 J A12/A149 Roundabout, A149 North Quay/Lawn Avenue/Caister Road/Yarmouth Road/Caister Bypass, A1064 Norwich Road/Main Road (Mautby, Acle, Upton with Fishley, Halvergate, Filby, Fleggburgh, West Caister, Caister-on-Sea).

(If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Order).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance.
