REPORT FROM BOROUGH COUNCILLOR – JANUARY 2024

Cllr. Penny Carpenter - North Caister Ward

- i) Norfolk County Council have instructed Norfolk Constabulary to investigate the illegal felling of 6- 8 oak trees situated on the Caister By-Pass, enquiries are being conducted by local officers. Norfolk County Council will undertake work to remove the fallen trees, clear the area and re-plant new trees.
- ii) Contractors have completed the installation of the crash barriers on the bypass but will return in March of 2024 to finish off by laying of earth, unfortunately all the wet weather we experienced during the construction it was decided to return to lay the earth in the new year.
- iii) My last report made reference to myself and Councillor Malcolm Bird due to meet with the Highways Engineer on the Norwich Road. We arranged to meet adjacent to Upper Grange Road to inspect the overgrown hedge which had grown over into the road. It was decided to arrange for a trim back to the edge of the pavement adjacent to the bus stop. This will be arranged by our Highways Engineer.
- iv) I received two e-mails from the Parish one being about the condition of the works in progress along the Ormesby Road, the complaint was passed over to Persimmon in Norwich. A representative from Persimmon did in fact attend site to inspect the pedestrian pavement conditions.

The second email covered the unfortunate situation of baby seals who had perished and asked for them to be removed, again I passed onto the Environment and GYS for their attention.

On both occasions I confirmed receipt of these emails and replied accordingly and advised your Parish Clerk of the situation.

- v) Persimmon, once the works have been completed on the Ormesby Road, Persimmon, are due to start on Jack Chase Way, however, I understand that other matters will be brought before Great Yarmouth Planning Department at some point. At time of writing this email I do not have information as to when this will be heard I have also advised the resident who lives on Prince Of Wales Road who independently set up a petition as to a 20 MPH zone at this location has also been informed of the process.
- vi) It has been a year since Norfolk County Council received £49.55m of funding from the Department for Transport (DFT) to improve bus services across the county. There have been huge numbers of improvements already made across the county, and the latest figures show that passenger numbers have increased throughout the year with the number of fare-paying passengers now exceeding pre-covid levels.
- vii) From County Council to Borough Council officers and councillors are faced with ever increasing demands on services, from my own perspective as Cabinet Member for Childrens Services there will be decisions that I will have to make. In the February meeting at County and Borough the subjects of Budgets will be discussed and debated.
- viii)I was sent correspondence via Great Yarmouth Planning Department with regard to 106 monies to be used in Caister and the applications made by three parties, I replied in support of all three applications.
- ix) Recently as the Mayor during December I was invited to a fund-raising event held at Branford's on behalf of the Church which was a well-supported evening. I have been delighted to hand over monies to Caister Lifeboat and Marie Curie as two of my nominated charities. I have had an extremely busy time since May 2023 and I have already resumed my duties as Mayor starting on the 4th of January 2024, and I continue to work for the residents of Caister and across the Borough and for the County as a Great Yarmouth Borough Councillor for Caister North and a County Councillor for the Division of Caister.

i) NATIONAL HIGHWAYS – updating on highway essential safety improvement works on the A47 between Brundall and Acle: This work includes improving warning signs, road markings, road studs, vegetation clearance, verge reinstatement and carriageway resurfacing, which will ensure the A47 remains in a safe and serviceable condition. They need to carry out some further work in the vicinity of Brundall Roundabout to complete these improvements, which will involve road marking and sign installations.

This work will take place from **Monday 15 January**, lasting **four nights**, working between the hours of **8pm and 6am**

Closures and diversions

To carry out the work safely, they will need to close parts the A47 westbound and divert traffic as detailed below:

A47 westbound traffic will be diverted to turn around at Acle Roundabout and follow the A47, A143, and A146, before re-joining the A47 at Postwick Interchange.

Access to local villages

To minimise disruption on locals, they are taking additional traffic management measures to enable access and egress from local villages. These are listed below: Despite the A47 being closed westbound at Acle Roundabout, westbound traffic will still be able to access the A47 westbound between A47 Acle entry slip and Lingwood Road. Traffic will reach a 'hard' closure point at High Noon Lane, Blofield, meaning access into Blofield and Brundall is maintained.

Whilst works on Brundall roundabout take place, temporary two-way lights will be stationed between the roundabout approaches at Cucumber Lane and Yarmouth Road, allowing the services to remain open and travel between Brundall and Blofield via Cucumber Lane.
